

Embroidery pattern from St Anna triptych

The pattern was drawn from the triptych of St. Anne by Quinten Massijs (dated 1509). Below is the entire pattern, and then the same in fragments - each on a separate sheet. The size of the pattern is 97x97 stitches.


The middle part of the cross can be filled with either a long-armed cross stitch, or classic cross stitch, or any variation of it. It is also possible to use other filler stitches, however, it should be taken into account that the outlines of the filled area may change slightly. The contours can be embroidered using a double stitch.


When working from the pattern, you should pay special attention to the arrangement of elements at the ends of the cross. The stitches in these elements are of the same length as the others, but their position is a bit off.






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
